

Sometimes the creative design in packaging a gift means more than the gift itself. An origami box is a creative and inexpensive way to package and create gifts to share and show you care.

Origami was initially known as orikata (folded shapes). In 1880, the craft became known as origami, coming from the Japanese words oru (to fold) and kami (paper). Tsutsumi, meaning "present" or "package" were folded paper gift wrappers used in some ceremonies to symbolize sincerity and purity.

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

Step 1 - Always begin with a square. You can fold any piece of paper diagonally from one corner to the opposite and cut excess paper. A trick is to fold your paper like the sail on a sailboat and then cut away excess paper.

Step 2 - Fold the paper in half and fold. Then open the piece of paper. Step 3, Fold the paper in half along the other side. Use your finger to fold and then open the paper again. There should now be creases that intersect at the center of the square.

Next, we will move our corners to the center and make sure that all of our points are touching and fold.

For Step 5 , fold the top and bottom edges to the center of the square and crease the edges of both folds. This shape will look like a rectangle when complete.


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

Step 6 - Unfold the square along one side. Unfold the halfway folds and the triangles beneath those folds. Leave the side triangles folded in.

Next, Fold the long edges to the center and crease the bottom edges. As a result, you should have what looks like a necktie with two points.

Now, start working on the walls and reinforcing our creases. To help, let's visualize the necktie points as tips. The necktie tip furthest away from us is the "top tip" and the necktie tip closest to us is the "bottom tip." The inside tips will be called "the inner tips". Match the necktie bottom tip to the inner tip below the necktie top tip and crease the bottom fold. Then, reopen. Rotate the necktie and repeat the same action as before.

Next step, pull up our flaps to create the side walls.

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

As we lift the final wall flaps, the creases from previous folds should form two triangle shaped flaps that must be folded inwards. Make sure that your triangles are folded inwards before moving on. The wall will fold over the triangles and the top triangle tip will fit neatly into the bottom of the box, which is where we will crease against the sides to keep the box together. After creasing, a triangle should be seen at the bottom of the box.

We will now repeat this process on the opposite side and make sure all of our folds are creased and clean. Your origami box is now complete.


